

**Summary of the doctoral thesis Marsilii de Inghen Quaestiones super libros I-II, IV-X,  
XII 'Metaphysicae' Aristotelis**

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This thesis presents the first critical edition of the sixth book of Marsilius of Inghen's commentary *Quaestiones super libros I-II, IV-X, XII 'Metaphysicae' Aristotelis*.

Recently, there has been growing interest in the life and work of Marsilius of Inghen, a 14th-century philosopher and theologian associated with the Universities of Paris and Heidelberg. In particular, scholars are focusing on his commentary on *Metaphysics*. The preparation of this edition is a continuation of research undertaken by scholars from the Faculty of Philosophy and the Interdepartmental Centre for Medieval Cultural History at the Catholic University of Lublin.

The dissertation consists of three parts. The first is an introduction to the critical edition. The second presents the most important philosophical issues of Book VI of Marsilius of Inghen's commentary. The third contains a critical edition of Book VI of his *Quaestiones*.

The editorial introduction presents the results of research on the published text: after collating the manuscripts and analysing individual lessons of the text, the relationships between the manuscript transmissions were determined and a *stemma codicum* was proposed. Moreover, descriptions of all manuscript transmissions are provided. The second part presents the structure of *Quaestiones* and the most important philosophical issues addressed in Book VI by Marsilius in his characteristic logical-semantic approach. These include the definition of the subject of metaphysical research, the question of *futura contingentia*, and the issue of truth and falsehood. The last part is a critical edition of *Quaestiones*, prepared in the Classical Text Editor.

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
