II COURSE OBJECTIVES:

The aim of the course is:

- 1. to develop all language skills (reading, listening, speaking and writing) at A2 level;
- 2. to develop communication skills in typical everyday situations;
- 3. to introduce basic vocabulary and grammatical structures to communicate in everyday situations;
- 4. to provide tools for further development of language skills, also in the academic context.

III. COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES:

A2 level according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages: SKILLS:

Learning outcomes according to main language skills: listening, reading, speaking, and writing *LISTENING*

- **U_01**. identifies phrases and the highest frequency vocabulary related to areas of most immediate personal relevance (place of living, family, work, education, leisure time, health etc) when the speaker speaks slowly and clearly;

READING
